

Registration Policies

****Please note that you must be a current member of AASP at the time you register for the conference in order to obtain the member rate. It is recommended that you renew membership a week to ten days prior to registering for the conference.**

There is no mail-in registration option this year. **Registration must be completed online.** Online registration will be available in early September. Please check your email and/or the AASP website for updates and a conference registration link. Whether you plan to pay by credit card or school district Purchase Order (PO), you will need to register online.

Registration must be received online on or before October 15th to qualify for early-bird registration rates. Regular registration deadline is October 30th. On-site registration is permitted only if space is available; conference materials are not guaranteed for on-site registrants. After October 30th, attendees will need to bring their registration form and full payment with them to the conference. Registration confirmation is provided by e-mail. No refunds will be given after October 30th.

Directions for Purchase Order Processing

1. Complete the conference registration form online. Be sure to select your morning and afternoon sessions for the day(s) of attendance.
2. Print the completed registration form and give it to the appropriate contact at the school district for processing of the PO.
3. The Purchase Order, with the registration form(s) attached, must either be e-mailed to admin@aasp-az.org or faxed to 480-893-7775. The Purchase Order must provide an e-mail address so that the AASP office can e-mail the invoice.
4. An invoice will be e-mailed for payment.
