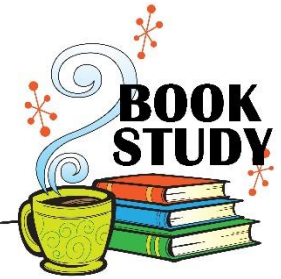

Executive function is a neuropsychological concept that refers to those processes required to plan and direct activities, including task initiation, follow through, sustained attention, inhibition of impulses and goal directed persistence. These are the self-regulating behaviors that are required for children to act responsibly and complete chores. This book provides tools for teachers, psychologists, speech/language professionals, and parents to help develop executive function skills in students with mild issues associated with normal growth and development to more severe impairments associated with brain injuries, neurological disorders, autism and ADHD.

Even the best teachers, with proactive positive behavior support systems in place, encounter problem behaviors in the classroom. Your initial response to bad behavior will determine whether that behavior is defused or escalated. It is important to understand how the interaction between the teacher and student impact behavior. This book provides teachers with steps for defusing common behavior problems in the classroom by focusing on students behaving appropriately, delaying the teacher's response to the student exhibiting the problem behavior, maintaining the flow of instruction, and using other intervention strategies.

Uniquely Human offers a new and compelling paradigm: the most successful approaches to autism don't aim at fixing a person by eliminating symptoms but by seeking to understand the individual's experience and what underlies the behavior. The book suggests that understanding autism should focus on enhancing abilities, building on strengths, and offering supports that will naturally lead to more desirable behavior and a better quality of life, arguing that attempts to eliminate "autistic" behaviors may actually interfere with important developmental processes. *Uniquely Human* offers a compassionate and insightful perspective that parents, professionals, and family members will find uplifting and hopeful.

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How does a book study work?

This book study uses the online platform, Edmodo. You are expected to read the book and at the end of each chapter, you will log into Edmodo for your assignment. Each assignment has 3-5 questions that you will need to answer. You can work at your own pace; however, all of your responses must be completed by midnight on December 30, 2017 to get credit.

Timeline: Registration and Payment is due by **September 8, 2017**. Starting on **September 11**, you will receive information on getting started. The book study must be completed by midnight on **December 30, 2017**.

Cost: Registration fee: is \$45 per book study and you must have access to the book. The books are available online or from the publisher. Register by completing the attached registration form.

Credit: All three books are approved 20 hours of ADE recertification credit. **Executive Skills in Children and Adolescents** and **Uniquely Human** are approved for 20 hours of DHS licensure credit for SLP/SLPAs.

Getting Started: On September 11, you will receive a Welcome email and be invited to join the book study group on Edmodo. You will receive information on how to navigate the system and timeline for completion. You can always get started earlier by ordering and reading the book.
