School Psychology FACULTY POSITION -ARIZONA CAMPUS

Ottawa University (est. 1865), one of the oldest private liberal arts universities in the United States, seeks candidates and/or nominations for a full-time School Psychology position with assignment in the University's School of Education. This position will be assigned the appropriate faculty rank based on teaching experience and academic credentials. Faculty member will be expected to teach courses (including online) in our School Psychology program. Primary responsibilities include teaching, advising, academic program guidance, and providing faculty leadership. Additional responsibilities may include program development and assessment, student advising, placement oversight, and directing student recruitment, as appropriate with academic background and experience.

Ottawa University is a multi-campus system and serves approximately 4000 students through its campuses in Kansas (main campus), Arizona, Wisconsin, Indiana (Louisville, KY area), and Online. Ottawa University is a regionally accredited, church-related, private university that strives to integrate faith, learning, and life in the academic experiences of students.

Minimum qualifications for this full-time, 12-month faculty position include: 5 years of post-graduate professional experience within School Psychology and a state license, an earned Doctoral Degree in School Psychology from an accredited institution and an accredited program for School Psychology, teaching experience in education, and holder of a current active unencumbered license as a School Psychologist in Arizona.

Preference will be given to those candidates with a National certification in a School Psychology (NASP), knowledge of current practices/trends in the clinical and community settings, and blackboard or equivalent Learning Management System experience. Rank and compensation will be commensurate with experience and academic preparation. Faculty member must display an enthusiasm for teaching curricula from a liberal arts perspective and have an interest in working with graduate and undergraduate-level (traditional and adult) learners.
